I. Call to Order and Roll Call:

- a. The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. by Chairperson Dan Ferguson.

II. Discussion and Possible Approval of Assisting the American Legion Organization with the July 4th Celebration (Action Item).

Motion made by Jon Gift to Assist the American Legion Organization with the July 4th Celebration. Seconded by Tonya Roland. Motion Carried Unanimously.

III. Open Forum.

- a. Mr. Robert Jensen, American Legion, said the American Legion will handle the advertising for the July 4th Celebration. The following items they will need help with:
 1. Parade
 2. Food Booths/or Any other Booths
 3. Games
 4. Coordinators

American Legion does handle the food, but he suggests it be split up more.

Mr. Cliff Eklund said he brought this up at the City Council Meeting, and the City Council was very supportive, and they thought it was great that everyone is working together to get this done. Everyone is in favor of doing a feed after 5:00p.m. or just before the Fireworks display. Chairperson Dan Ferguson and Mr. Cliff Eklund have been discussing a buffalo feed at that time. Mr. Cliff Eklund has spoken with people in Battle Mountain and Eureka, and they said if Carlin does something like that they would want to come for it.

Mr. Cliff Eklund said he's in the process of locating buffalo, and has been talking with the Horseshoe Ranch, they said if they could not sell one, there's a lot of cutting horse people around that use buffalo for training their cutting

horses with, and when they get to big they don't use them anymore, so they sell them off.

Chairperson Dan Ferguson states the main purpose is to get people there and keep them here all day. The food and the games will keep them there.

Chairperson Dan Ferguson said some people have gotten a hold of him on some different things as follows:

1. Horseshoe Tournament – High School Baseball Team wants to put it on.
2. Poker Walk – Carlin Parks & Recreation Board always puts that on first thing in the morning, and would like to do that again.
3. Cake Walk – Friends of Library
4. Food – Cheerleaders in Carlin wanted to know if they could do lemonade and strawberry shortcake.
5. Games – Booster Club will do kids games.
6. Bingo – American Legion Auxiliary
7. Watermelon Eating Contest – PTA
8. Car Wash – Studio 2B (Girl Scouts)
9. Dunk Tank – Fire Department
10. Karaoke/Talent Contest – Has been talked about.
11. Home Run Derbies – For Hardball & Softball.
12. Horny toad Races – Was brought up.
13. Frog Jumping – Was brought up.
14. All City Tournament – Where they have a team of players, they play baseball, volleyball, basketball, tennis and have sprints 100 yard dash, and long distance running, you do it as a team.

These are just some of the things that have been brought up. Mr. Tim Sirotek has been looking into getting the Fireworks down at the Park.

Mrs. Suzanne Boralho states she's been in charge of the float judges for the past five, six years, and would like to do it again.

Mr. Cliff Eklund asks if the Buffalo Feed is something the Parks & Recreation Board would like to do. The proceeds would go toward, completing the skate park, the driving range, building a swimming pool.

Mr. Tim Sirotek said he would ask the City to sponsor a Street Dance.

Mr. Ben Gunnels states Big Guns charges \$100.00 for the first four hours and \$75.00 an hour after that. For a PA system he charges \$50.00 an hour, but he will give a flat rate of \$200.00 and he will be there all day. Total would be \$675.00 for all day PA and Street Dance.

Chairperson Dan Ferguson states he knows for sure they're going to have vendors, games, food. They need to decide on who's going to do the Parade, and they need

to come up with a theme. The American Legion will do the Parade, a committee will be formed to help. Needs to start after church.

Mrs. Karla Jones asks is everything going to start at 1:00p.m. or would there be activities going on before that at the park. As Carlin Fire Representative she will take it back to the Fire Department, she can't guarantee they'll be able to do anything, with them having to be in the Parade. Her concerns is having enough people to run the Dunk Tank, Parade, and setting up Fireworks.

Chairperson Dan Ferguson said he's sure they can get enough people rounded up to help run the Dunk Tank. Canopies will be needed. Committee's will be formed for every activity. Such as prizes/awards for the Parade.

Ms. Ellen Meshefski suggests a White Elephant Table, Toilet Paper Races, Tug-O-War, Egg Toss, Three Legged Race.

Mr. Robert Jensen asks Ellen Meshefski to do the National Anthem during the Flag Raising Ceremony. This will be done right after the Parade.


